Title 2 positions as Early State Researcher (ESR) in subprojects of a Marie Skłodowska Curie training network on human dignity and freedom.

Institution 1) University of Reading - U.K.
2) University of Aarhus - DK

Position The ETN traces the historical roots and transformations of the modern conception of the human being and the human values of dignity and freedom, especially in theological and philosophical traditions, with a focus on the church father Origen of Alexandria. The ITN offers an interdisciplinary environment and an innovative training program that allows the ESRs to obtain specialist knowledge of a specific research topic as well as transferable skills that can be used in non-academic institutions.

1) One position at Univ. Reading (England): The ESR project will focus on Origen and Bernard of Clairvaux; the ESR will have a 2-year position, with the possibility of an extension to a third year under a University stipend scheme in order to allow the completion of a PhD if the candidate should choose this option.
2) One position at Univ. Aarhus (Denmark): The ESR will be offered a 3-year PhD contract at Aarhus University, Denmark, and will study Origen and the modern Protestant tradition.

Responsibilities Research activities with respect to the specific ESR subprojects
Career development through participation in local and network wide trainings as well as secondments in other countries/institutions during their studies.

Requirements Internationally recognized Master's or equivalent degree in theology, history, philosophy, classics, religious history, or a related field.
Must hold less than four years of research experience after their Master's degree and have not resided more than 12 of the last 36 months in the country where the position is located for which they apply.
