Post-doc Position: researcher should have a university degree in biostatistics, mathematics, epidemiology, public health or related fields

Research at BIPS covers the whole epidemiological research cycle – identification of causes of diseases (etiology), development of prevention programs, their implementation and evaluation, up to consulting politicians and the general public.

The three core elements of the research strategy of BIPS, a focus on the population, prevention and a life-course perspective, are implemented in six broad areas: child health, healthy ageing, cancer prevention, drug safety, evidence-based primary prevention and methodological research.

One main focus is put on the identification and prevention of lifestyle-related diseases, especially in children and adolescents, focusing on obesity and its comorbidities. But also methodological issues like the statistical modeling of gene-gene- and gene-environment interactions, the identification of biological pathways involved in the development of diseases as well as modeling of accumulations of risk over the life-course are of special interest.
